God moved so powerfully in Kuujjuaq by manifesting himself in the deepness of his love and nature. Topics taught on ‘Who is this Jesus?’ in the bible, what is religion? What is the difference? These topics came as real revelation

as God would touch everyone in deep ways, melting hearts. Even as Christians, we were challenged into coming deeper or desiring to seek more of the person of Jesus and not religion. This conference was a real eye opener for many and for some who attended it decided to go to Quaqtaq afterwards because of the revelation they were receiving from these teachings. They wanted more.

The annual visit to Quaqtaq seems to be advancing each year incredibly in the area of equipping and training for the Inuit. People who had attended the previous trainings of the Singing Waters Ministries had the opportunity to give out and practice in this healing and deliverance ministry. The numbers in support to the team increased this year, offering their time and support all throughout. It was really amazing to witness God move so quickly in the area of healing and deliverance among the people who participated.

The participants came from all parts of Nunavik and Nunvut. It was people with prepared, receptive, attentive hearts and who hungered for this teaching. I believe, as a result, we saw an increase and acceleration in deliverance and healing in an incredible way.

There is a multiplication happening. As people who attend share of their experience and healing encounters, those who hear come the following year. There is also an increase in invitations for the Inuit teachers to come and share in other communities. With this growing demand, it is in everyone’s vision to see more Inuit equipped to become a part of working teams to better reach more people.

The lasting fruit is attracting many who are seeking freedom more and more. Therefore, there is much

hope and excitement with what God is doing in our land.

An Update From Andy Koornstra

It is absolutely amazing to see what is transpiring in the East and Western Arctic over this past year. I have been privileged to visit several communities over the last few months and have noticed the change that is taking in the lives of the Inuit. Being involved with the Arctic church since 1987, I am beginning to understand when the Lord talks about going from one degree of glory to another degree of glory. This isn't just about an awakening to the heart of Jesus, but a deep transformation is accelerating in the hearts of these precious saints. This move of God is going deeper than I have ever seen where the heart of the Father is bringing healing and life to unresolved issues.

In January I took part in a Men's Conference in Quataq and was impressed by the genuine repentance and surrender that took place. Men were rededicating their lives to the Lordship of Jesus and willing to surrender their deepest pain and issues to the Father.

In March I had the privilege of doing a seminar of "Releasing the Gifts" with Sandra Van Binsbergen from Orangeville, Ontario. What a joy to see people responding to their unique calling and gifts.

In April the main Arctic Conference was hosted in Rankin Inlet and the theme of the conference was "Crossing the Jordan." I had the opportunity to share about the enemies of fear, rejection, worthlessness, shame, insecurity, defilement and hopelessness and how these altars keep us from enjoying our promise land inheritance. These seven basic influences are the lies that control us and bind many Christians from entering into

intimacy and presence of God.

July I joined a awesome team consisting of Eva Deer, John LaFramboise, James and Looee Arreak where we shared at a Youth Healing Conference. Signs and wonders were demonstrated by the hand of the Lord and we heard many testimonies how people were touched and healed.

In September Eva Deer, Sandra Van Binsbergen and myself had the awesome opportunity to do our second healing school in Rankin Inlet. It was an awesome success and we are planning to do another school in 2008.

An organization representing these congregations will be established to act on their behalf. The leadership of the Organization will be made up of the Pastors and leaders of the churches with officers elected from them.
