was in the South and I had multiple ministry trips as well.

I have included reports from Andy and Bob in this News Letter. As we look forward to continued Economic Recovering in 2012, we are also expecting recovery in the realms of the Spirit. Reports from our Arctic Churces indicate an increase in Youth attendance and a freedom to worship the Lord. The Church in Umuijaq is experiencing Revival and is asking for ministry teams to come and sow into what is happening.

God willing, we will be starting two

new building projects this year and seeing the dedication of the new church in Iqaluit. I will be need work teams to join me as we working with the communities of Quaqtaq and Kangirsuk on these new buildings. Pray for favour with the Government. New building codes require wash rooms and handicap accessibility for all the new churches, plus they must be build to the new northern regulations. Costs for these building have increased at least five fold over the last ten years and twenty fold since John Spillenaar build the first church in the Arctic. .

In February I will be ministering at two differencet regions in the Arctic. First in Arctic Bay, Nunavut on Northern Baffin Island and then in Akulavik, Nunavik in Northern Quebec. Following that I will be part of a ministry time with Men Arise in in Inukjuak, Quebec.

I left on September 26th and arrived in POV where I stayed until the 28th. I was able to catch up with friends and visit many church members there before going on to

Wakeham Bay. I ministered at Annie and Mark Tertluk's church in Wakeham until Nov. 3rd. There was a hunger for God's Word and I was able to teach in depth on various topics. One of these was "Why is Jesus worthy", a three part study of Jeremiah 32 and the buying of the field at Anathoth, followed by a look at Ruth and what it means to be a "Kinsman Redeemer", and finishing with Revelation 5 and the sealed scroll. Having a clear understanding why He is Worthy releases us to a fuller freedom in our worship of Him. So often we sing songs about His worthiness without really understanding how utterly unique He is. I also taught on Blessing and Cursing and generational sin, as well as a series on the history of Israel. These were but three of the topics covered during my stay. This past year most doubt has been an incredible time of challenges but with amazing opportunities. Our teams had the privilege of touching several Cree and Inuit communities in Ontario, Quebec, Nunavik and Nunavut. Most of these endeavours have been funded and supported by wellness centres, health boards and churches. We are encouraged to see many people healed from traumas, abuses, addictions and self-worth issues. Dealing with unhealthy and ungodly belief systems and leading people to a revelation of their God intended identity and purpose has been so rewarding.

I felt that the word of Lord for 2012 was that there would be a new level of His favour being released upon the body of Christ. The four words that came from the Lord involved revelation, increase, enlargement and sustainability.

(1.) Revelation...to set you free from life-long patterns that have kept you from living in your inheritance.

(2) Increase of momentum, energy and endurance to run the race.

(3) Enlargement, greater capacity to receive from God in this particular season.

(4) Sustainability...in order to retain and release the magnitude of God's gifting and graces.

Another word that has been heard throughout the body has been that the hearts of the fathers' will turn back to the children and the hearts' of the children back to the fathers. The key to community revival is when our men are set free from shame and fear and return to their God-given potential. Paul said that we have ten thousand instructors but very few fathers. I am so blessed to be part of men arise in the north and the Aaqituavik Healing Centre based in Quaqtak bring healing back to the men and women of the north.

healings were testified to. Four young women in their early twenties made first time commitments to the Lord. I was invited to speak to each of the religion classes in the school. I spent a week in the school meetings and talking with the children. God moved in a variety of ways in their lives as I was able to answer and address their questions. God is at work! Seeds were planted. I had a few sessions in homes dealing with forgiveness issues with dear friends.

It was good to pick up the guitar and sing as well on this trip. When I returned to POV for a week before heading out I was invited by Aipilie Kenuayyak to minister to the youth group at the Anglican church. Aipilie was my principal while I taught for six years in POV. He and I have had many times of fellowship and prayer together over the years. He introduced me to the Youth Group and told the story of when he hired me in April of 2003.

"fell in love with me" This was God's favour going before me. In fact, Mark Terteluk also interviewed me in my hotel room as well for a teaching job in Wakeham. As a result he and I have had a close friendship ever since even though I never taught in his community but went to teach in POV. I spoke on "the way to God", using examples of how the birds, fish and caribou all follow the way God has prepared for them. I was able to minister one-on-one after the service. Praise God. I was away from home for seven weeks but the time went quickly and God accomplished His will. I was truly blessed. So many brothers and sisters among the Inuit. As stated in Phil. 2:13 "For it is God which works in you both to will and to do of His good pleasure."

He invites us to join Him in His work and when He does you discover it is your desire to do the very thing He is calling you to do. God sent my wife and I north to teach high school among the Inuit for six years and as a result we have been honoured to meet so many new brothers and sisters. Doors are now open all over the north for me to minister. Only God can do such things! We love the Inuit and are loved in return. God has a purpose for these dear people; a purpose that will far exceed anything we can imagine. It is such a pleasure and an honour to be one of many others who are invited to go north and fellowship with them. Thank you Lord; You are mighty.
