The plans for the Kangirsuk Church are moving along very slowly. I am planning to put together several teams to work on the building of the church next year. If you would like to be part of a team, please contact me.

A Men Arise Conference is planned for November 7th thru 12th in Kuujuaq, Quebec by the founder Johnny Ouvaut. Andy and I will be ministering.

The September Arctic Leaders Conference in Iqaluit went well. Dr. Russ Moyer was the speaker. He challenged the leaders with a Word to go forward.

On July 3rd thru 6th, I attended the Annual Bible Conference in Red Lake Ontario. It was an opportunity to minister and fellowship with Pastor Roy Beardy and First Nation pastors.

Andy Koornstra reported a good conference in the James Bay and Arctic Quebec regions. See the separate report.

In July, I travelled to Iqaluit with a building team. They were able to accomplish a considerable amount of work. Team members included Lorne Hall, Gary Mills and myself. Carpeting, wiring, painting, laminate flooring for the offices, doors and partitions for washrooms were on the list of jobs. The church building will soon be ready for the official dedication. As mentioned earlier, the plans for the Kangirsuk Church are moving along, and I will be meeting with the church leaders and building teams over the next few months to plan for next Summer.

I co-ordinated the delivery chairs, church supplies and food to some First Nations churches in Cochrane and Moose Factory. Over six tons were delivered. A Special Thank you to Faith Ministries Ontario and Ontario North Railway for their assistance.

Finally I want to mention that AMOTF is also lending a hand with the establishing of a new ministry on Cape Breton Island with Fern

Over this last year I have seen a tremendous longing among the Cree and Inuit brothers and sisters in the desire to be healed and transformed in their spirit, soul and body. The desire to mature in their understanding of what it means to be a son and daughter has captivated their hearts. One of the greatest revelations that many are receiving is the difference of living under the covenant of grace and truth as opposed to the old wineskin of the law. This truth is beginning to

make a tremendous impact in their lives, families and communities. Another major revelation is that they are living in the fullness of the completed work of Christ. And of His fullness we have all received, and grace for grace. John 1:16

The law was just a shadow of the true substance that was to be imparted to us through Christ. What the law was powerless to do, Christ has done for us. Romans 8:3-4. For what the law could not do in that it was weak through the flesh, God did by sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh, on account of sin: He condemned sin in the flesh, that the righteous requirement of the law might be fulfilled in us who do not walk according to the flesh but according to the Spirit.

Nunavut founding father Tagak Curley shared his vision of the Church working closer alongside the government. Mr. Curley has been active in the political arena for the past forty years both in the Old NWT and Nunavut governments. He is a recipient of the order of Canada for his work in the formation of Canada's latest territory, Nuvavut.

The event was organized by Dino Bruce and his wife Marilyn who moved to Truro, Nova Scotia six years ago.

Speakers included Pastor Leonie Duffy from Coral Harbour, Pastor Haitie Alagalak, Larry Alagalak youth leader from Arviat, Louie Bruce, worship leader from Coral Harbour and Dino Bruce, Truro, Nova Scotia.

While there, I had the opportunity to minister at the Living Word Fellowship in Bridgetown, where Rev. Jack Skafte is the pastor. Pastor Skafte was my host and driver for the four days I was in Nova Scotia. DE
